WHEREAS, the Authority's Executive Director concurs with the aforementioned recommendations to reject the bid submitted by Maguire Electrical Construction, LLC as non-responsive; and

WHEREAS, following the rejection of the bid submitted by Maguire Electrical Construction, LLC as non-responsive, the apparent lowest responsible bidder for Contract GTUA 1704 – Generator Replacement is Ronald Janney Electrical Contractor, Inc.; and

#### I. INTRODUCTION

This office has reviewed all documents provided regarding the bid submissions for the contract for the Generator Replacement project on behalf of the Gloucester Township Municipal Utilities Authority ("GTMUA" and/or "Authority"). The GTMUA received six (6) bids for the specified Contract. The bids were received on Tuesday, December 12, 2017 at 10:00 a.m. as follows:

6. GMH Associates	\$169,289.00
Engineer's Estimate:	\$100,000.00

#### II. FACTUAL ANALYSIS

The apparent low bid for the above referenced contract was submitted by Maguire Electrical Construction, LLC ("Maguire"). Upon review of the bid submitted by Maguire, defects were uncovered.

Specifically, the bid specifications were based on a MTU generator or functional equivalents. According to Dennis DePuy and Thomas Leisse, PE, CME of Pennoni Associates, Inc. the generator submitted within Maguire's bid does not meet the technical specifications in three (3) areas. First, the specified alternator motor starting kVA is 80 Degree Rise, 300kVA at 25% instantaneous Voltage dip. The bid submitted by Maguire included an alternator motor starting kVA with 130 Degree Rise, therefore not satisfying that technical requirement. Additionally, the specified sound attenuation is 74.4 dBA at 23FT at 100% Load, Free Field Environment. Maguire submitted a "Kohler sound enclosure", and no open field sound testing was performed as specified, therefore not satisfying that technical requirement. Finally, the specifications required that accessories, Battery Charger, Coolant Heater, and Anti Condensation Strip Heater be mounted and factory wired to customer connection terminal block. The generator submitted by Maguire does not include factory wiring harness with accessed mounted and wired appropriately, therefore not satisfying that technical requirement. In light of the aforementioned, Pennoni Associates, Inc. has recommended the rejection of the bid submitted by Maguire.

The second apparent low bidder for the above referenced contract was Ronald Janney Electrical Contractor, Inc. ("Janney"). Upon review of the bid submitted by Janney, the bid complies with the specifications from a technical and legal perspective.

#### III. LEGAL ANALYSIS

The Local Public Contracts Law, <u>N.J.S.A.</u> 40A:11-1 et seq. regulates bidding on Contracts of public entities in New Jersey. In general, the practice of public bidding is universally recognized and deeply imbedded in the public policy of the State of New Jersey. <u>N.E.R.I. Corp. v. New Jersey Highway Authority</u>, 147 <u>N.J.</u> 223, 236 (1996). There is a prima facie presumption that power and discretion of governmental action in awarding bids on public Contracts has been properly exercised. <u>Colonnelli Bros., Inc. v. Village</u> of Ridgefield Park, 284 N.J.Super. 538, 541 (App.Div.1995).

Public bidding statutes are to be construed with sole reference to the public good and rigidly adhered to by courts. Hall Const. Co., Inc. v. New Jersey Sports & Exposition Authority, 295 N.J.Super. 629, 634 (App.Div.1996). Furthermore, public bidding statutes exist for the good of taxpayers, not bidders, and they must always be construed for the public good and to guard against favoritism, improvidence, extravagance, and corruption. Sevell v. New Jersey Highway Authority, 329 N.J.Super. 580, 584 (App.Div.2000).

Every Contract awarded by the contracting agent for the provision or performance of any goods or services, the cost of which in the aggregate exceeds the bid threshold, shall be awarded only by Resolution of the governing body of the contracting unit to the lowest responsible bidder after public advertising for bids and bidding therefore. N.J.S.A. 40A:11-4. "Lowest responsible bidder or vendor" means the bidder or vendor: (a) whose response to a request for bids offers the lowest price and is responsive; and (b) who is responsible. N.J.S.A. 40A:11-2. The lowest responsible bidder on a public Contract must not only be deemed responsible but must submit the lowest bid which conforms to the Contract specifications. Matter of Protest of Award of On-Line Games Production & Operation Services Contract, Bid No. 95-X-20175, 279 N.J.Super. 566, 590 (App.Div.1995).

It is firmly established in New Jersey that material conditions contained in bidding specifications may not be waived. Terminal Const. Corp. v. Atlantic Cty. Sewerage Auth., 67 N.J. 403, 409 (1975). A

contracting body is generally without discretion to accept a defective bid. Meadowbrook Carting Co. v. Borough of Island Heights, 138 N.J. 307, 314 (1994). However, while material conditions contained in bidding specifications may not be waived, this rule does not apply to minor or inconsequential conditions. Public contracting units may resolve problems arising from such conditions in a sensible or practical way. Terminal Const. Corp., 67 N.J. at 409-11. Materiality of a particular specification is to be determined as a matter of law. Hanover Tp. v. Inter. Fidelity Ins. Co., 122 N.J.Super. 544, 548 (App.Div.1973).

There are two (2) criteria for determining whether a specific non-compliance constitutes a substantial and, hence, non-waivable irregularity: (1) Whether the effect of a waiver would be to deprive the public body of its assurance that the Contract will be entered into, performed, and guaranteed according to its specific requirements; and (2) Whether it is of such a nature that its waiver would adversely affect competitive bidding by placing a bidder in a position of advantage over the other bidders or by otherwise undermining the necessary common standard of competition. Township of River Vale v. R.J. Longo Constr. Co., 127 N.J.Super. 207, 222 (Law.Div.1974).

The court has provided further guidance as to materiality where an error is "patent and the true intent of the bidder obvious". In such a situation, the Appellate Division has held that such an error may be disregarded by the public agency. The Court held that certain non-compliance (i.e. obvious error) with the bid specifications may be deemed not material and therefore waivable by the public entity. Spina v. Borough of Fairview, 304 N.J. Super. 425, (App. Div. 1997).

As a matter of law, the Local Public Contract Law requires certain items to be included as material aspects of every bid. The statute reads:

"When required by the bid plans and specifications, the following requirements shall be considered mandatory items to be submitted at the time specified by the contracting unit for the receipt of the bids; the failure to submit any one of the mandatory items shall be deemed a fatal defect that shall render the bid proposal unresponsive and that cannot be cured by the governing body:

- a. A guarantee to accompany the bid pursuant to section 21 of P.L.1971, c.198 (C.40A:11-21);
- b. A certificate from a surety company pursuant to section 22 of P.L.1971, c.198 (C.40A:11-22);
- c. A statement of corporate ownership pursuant to section 1 of P.L.1977, c.33 (C.52:25-24.2);
- d. A listing of subcontractors pursuant to section 16 of P.L.1971, c.198 (C.40A:11-16);
- e. A document provided by the contracting agent in the bid plans, specifications, or bid proposal documents for the bidder to acknowledge the bidder's receipt of any notice or revisions or addenda to the advertisement or bid documents;"

Finally, a local contracting unit is permitted to reject all bids within a part under certain conditions. N.J.S.A. 40A:11-13.2, provides in pertinent part:

- "A local contracting unit may reject <u>all</u> bids for any of the following reasons:
- a. Lowest bid substantially exceeds cost estimates;
- b. Lowest bid substantially exceeds appropriation;
- c. Governing body abandons the project;
- d. Contracting unit wants to substantially revise the bid specifications;
- e. Purpose and/or provisions of the LPCL are violated; or
- f. Governing body opts to use the state contract."

N.J.S.A. 40A:11-13.2.

As outlined above, the bid submitted by Maguire did not comply with the technical specifications. Such noncompliance is a clear defect within their bid. It is my legal opinion that a waiver of such a defect would unquestionably deprive the Authority of its assurances that the Contract will be entered into, performed and guaranteed according to its specific requirements, as the submitted generator fails to meet the minimum requirements of the bid specifications. Moreover, a waiver of the aforementioned defect would place Maguire in a position of advantage over other potential bidders who would have been required to, and did submit a generator which met the technical requirements. As such, based upon the Court's holdings in Terminal Const. Corp. and River Vale, the Authority is left with no alternative but to reject the bid submitted by Maguire as non-responsive due the defects within their bid package as further outlined above.

Following the rejection of the bid submitted by Maguire as non-responsive, the lowest responsive bidder is Janney. The bid submitted by Janney contained no deviations from the specifications and complies with the bid specifications from both a technical and legal perspective.

The bid submitted by Janney is in the appropriate form.

#### V. CONCLUSION

After researching the applicable law, reviewing the contract specifications and documents, and conferring with staff, it is my legal opinion that the bid submitted by Maguire be rejected as non-responsive for the reasons as set forth above. It is my further opinion that the contract for GTUA-1704 — Generator Replacement be awarded to Ronald Janney Electrical Contractor, Inc. It is further recommended that a Resolution be placed on the Agenda for an upcoming meeting rejecting the bid of Maguire as non-responsive and awarding said Contract to Janney subject to staff concurrence and the availability of funds.

Dear Ray:

Six (6) bids were received for the aforementioned project on December 12<sup>th</sup> at 10:00 AM (original copies on file at the Authority). A copy of the bid tabulation is enclosed.

Maguire Electrical Construction, LLC submitted the low bid of \$94,130.00. After review of Maguire's bid I have determined that the generator submitted with the bid does not meet the required specifications in the bid document. A letter outlining the deficiencies is enclosed.

Pending the Authority Solicitor's determination, I recommend that the Authority reject Maguire's bid.

Ronald Janney Electrical Contractor, Inc. (Janney) submitted the 2<sup>nd</sup> lowest bid of \$105,300.00. Janney made no noted exceptions to the Specifications.

I have reviewed the bid response of Janney and found them in compliance with the bid documents provided. Janney has successfully completed similar projects in the past.

Pending the Authority Solicitor's determination, I recommend that the Authority award the generator replacement contract to Ronald Janney Electrical Contractor, Inc.

In connection with the referenced project, I have reviewed the bid prepared by Maguire Electrical Construction, LLC.

After review of Maguire's bid I have determined that the generator submitted with the bid does not meet the minimum requirements as specifications in the bid document.

The specifications were based on a MTU generator with listed know equivalents by Caterpillar and Cummins in accordance with NJAC 5:34-9.2. The bidder submitted a Kohler generator with the bid.

In accordance with NJAC 5:34-9.2, the bidder shall be responsible for documenting the equivalence claim.

Based on the limited information provided with the bid the following items do not meet the minimum specifications:

- 1. The specified alternator motor starting kVA is 80 Degree Rise, 300kVA at 25% instantaneous Voltage Dip. The bidder submitted an alternator motor starting kVA with 130 Degree Rise.
- 2. The specified sound attenuation is 74.4 dBA at 23FT (7 meters) at 100% Load, Free Field Environment. The bidder submitted a "Kohler sound enclosure", no open field sound testing was performed as specified.
- 3. The specifications required that accessories, Battery Charger, Coolant Heater, and Anti Condensation Strip Heater be mounted and factory wired to customer connection terminal block. The generator submitted by the bidder does not include factory wiring harness with accessories mounted and wired to terminal block at the.

In accordance with NJAC 5:34-9.2, failure to submit the required documentation shall be grounds for rejection of the claim of equivalence.

The total sewer budget variance is (\$553,709.00) or -10.0%. The main reason for the decrease is the Authority's 1993 bonds had its final maturity in the FY 2018 budget. As a result, debt service principal and interest appropriations were decreased significantly, principal by -50% and interest by -29%. The only other sewer individual appropriation with a change of more than 10% was Repairs/Maintenance/System Expenses. The reason for the 38.7% increase was the Authority management moved annual expenses out of its capital budget and into operating for major system expenses. The total solid waste budget variance is \$43,850.00.00 or 2.1% with no individual revenue accounts exceeding a 10% change. One solid waste line item of operations had a variance in excess of 10%. Vehicle Expenses had a variance of 25.8% as a result of an increase gasoline and tire purchasing. The Municipal/County Appropriation decreased by \$20,000.00, which was less than 10%.

The budget will have no increase on the revenue realized but because of the significant drop in debt service appropriations (Principal & Interest), the amount needed from rents to balance the budget was decreased by 15%. The Authority is utilizing the unanticipated rent revenue that will be realized to support its capital budget program. Connection fee revenue was decreased by \$30,000.00 or -13% because the Township is approaching buildout and the Authority does not want to rely on these fees to support its operations.

3. Describe the state of the local/regional economy and how it may impact the proposed Annual Budget, including the planned Capital Budget/Program.

The local/regional economy is stable and has no real impact on the annual budget.

Unrestricted net position was only used to offset the Municipal/County Appropriation as required.

As stated in #4, funds will be transferred to the Township of Gloucester after the budget is adopted as a budget subsidy to offset a potential tax rate increase.

The Authority's implementation of GASB Statement 68 required the recording of the Authority's portion of its unfunded pension liability. As a result, the Authority's unrestricted net position ended the fiscal year (Audited) in a deficit. If the liability was not recorded, the Authority's unrestricted net position would not be a deficit. The Authority will continue to pay its annual contractually required contribution to the Division of Pensions which contains an amount to fund its unfunded accrued liability and monitor the investments held by the State Division of Pensions in hopes that the liability will decrease and eliminate the deficit. If or when the Authority is informed that it must pay its unfunded pension liability, it will then address how the liability will be funded and the impact it will have on its rates. It would best serve the Authority and its rate payers, if the deficit was eliminated over a five to ten-year span.
