ENGINEER'S REPORT GLOUCESTER TOWNSHIP M.U.A.

April 15, 2021

- The Contractor for the sewer rehabilitation project is preparing traffic control plans for the areas identified in the contract documents. My office will coordinate with the Contractor, the County Engineer's Office and Gloucester Township regarding road opening permit and approval of traffic control measures.
- 2. On March 19th, partial payment in the amount of \$20,987.50 was released for the completion of the second half of the 2020 Emergency Generator Maintenance and Inspection Services contract completed by Penn Power Systems.
- 3. On April 6th, the concrete base pad was poured for the new Stephen Drive Pumping Station generator. The generator is scheduled to be installed the week of April 19th.
- 4. On April 7th, a recommendation for final payment in the amount of \$9,515.00 was submitted for the supply and installation of the Lincoln Avenue Pumping Station generator by Janney Electrical Contractors, Inc. Also included is a recommendation for Change Order #1 in the amount of \$500 for the removal and disposal of the existing generator that was not included in the original project scope.
- 5. The bid documents for the current Emergency Generator Maintenance and Inspection Services contract have been advertised and will be reviewed for the May meeting.
- 6. My office is working with the Authority to investigate and evaluate wet well aeration systems to address odor and grease issues at several pumping stations. The Authority is currently running a trial of a system at the Sicklerville Road Pumping Station
